

- Replacement of Basement Refrigerator The basement fridge was damaged last year, and at that time, the council decided it was unnecessary to replace and should be hauled away. The fridge has since been removed from the basement. Brenda Mawdsley is now petitioning the council to replace it. However, there are concerns regarding the space, as modern fridges tend to be much larger, as well as the actual need for a new fridge since the old one has been non-functional for a year, and there have been no other requests for a replacement. Previous discussions with the leaders of the Sunday School and VBS programs revealed that they did not require a fridge but could see a use for a small dorm-size fridge occasionally. A motion was made by Gwen Larson to table any decisions regarding the replacement of the fridge, to allow time to assess the actual need and explore options for the space.
